

Directions:

FROM I-5 NORTH OR SOUTH: Take Interstate 5 to exit 194A to Springfield. Follow I-105/126 to the Springfield City Center exit. Turn right onto Pioneer Parkway. Turn Left on A Street, left on 5th Street, and left on B Street. OVRA is on the corner of B Street and 4th Street. (OVRA is the 2nd building on the right.)

FROM THE EAST: Take Highway 126 (McKenzie Highway) into Springfield. Turn right on 5th Street, then left on B Street. OVRA is on the corner of B Street and 4th Street. (OVRA is the 2nd building on the right.)

FROM THE WEST: Take Highway 38, 126, or 34 to Interstate 5. Take I-5 to exit 194A to Springfield. Go east and take the first exit to Springfield City Center. Turn right onto Pioneer Parkway. Turn left on A Street, left on 5th Street, and left on B Street. OVRA is on the corner of B Street and 4th Street. (OVRA is the 2nd building on the right.)

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

WHAT SERVICES DOES OVRA OFFER?

Oregon Veterinary Referral Associates, P.C. offers state-of-the-art medical and surgical care for your pet. Your veterinarian has referred you to OVRA because we are able to provide advanced diagnostic evaluations (such as endoscopy, ultrasound, and specialized X-ray studies), treatments for severe illness or injury (such as fracture repair, spinal surgery, and cancer chemotherapy), and extended hospital care for critically ill pets Monday through Friday. Our doctors have completed medical or surgical residencies and are trained in the skills needed for the diagnosis and management of difficult diseases and conditions. We are also able to offer around-the-clock care, Monday through Friday for pets needing continuous hospital care.

WHAT CAN I EXPECT DURING MY APPOINTMENT?

During your appointment, your pet's medical history and information provided by your family veterinarian will be reviewed. Following a thorough physical exam, your OVRA doctor will discuss your pet's condition with you in detail. Any diagnostic tests, treatments, or procedures will be explained, and an estimate of costs will be provided to you. Most tests and procedures are scheduled for the day following your appointment, since procedure times are coordinated to integrate radiology, ultrasonography, surgery, and anesthesia staff and equipment. Some pets are hospitalized so that these tests and procedures can be completed as quickly as possible.

WHAT SHOULD I DO TO PREPARE FOR MY APPOINTMENT?

In addition to this information sheet, it is important that you bring copies of any medical records, laboratory data, and radiographs (X-rays) to your appointment. Your family veterinarian should have the information you will need. It is best not to feed your pet the morning of the appointment (water can be provided at all times) in case blood tests are needed that day.
